With this forward-thinking approach, we are committed to fostering a more holistic learning experience for all our students.

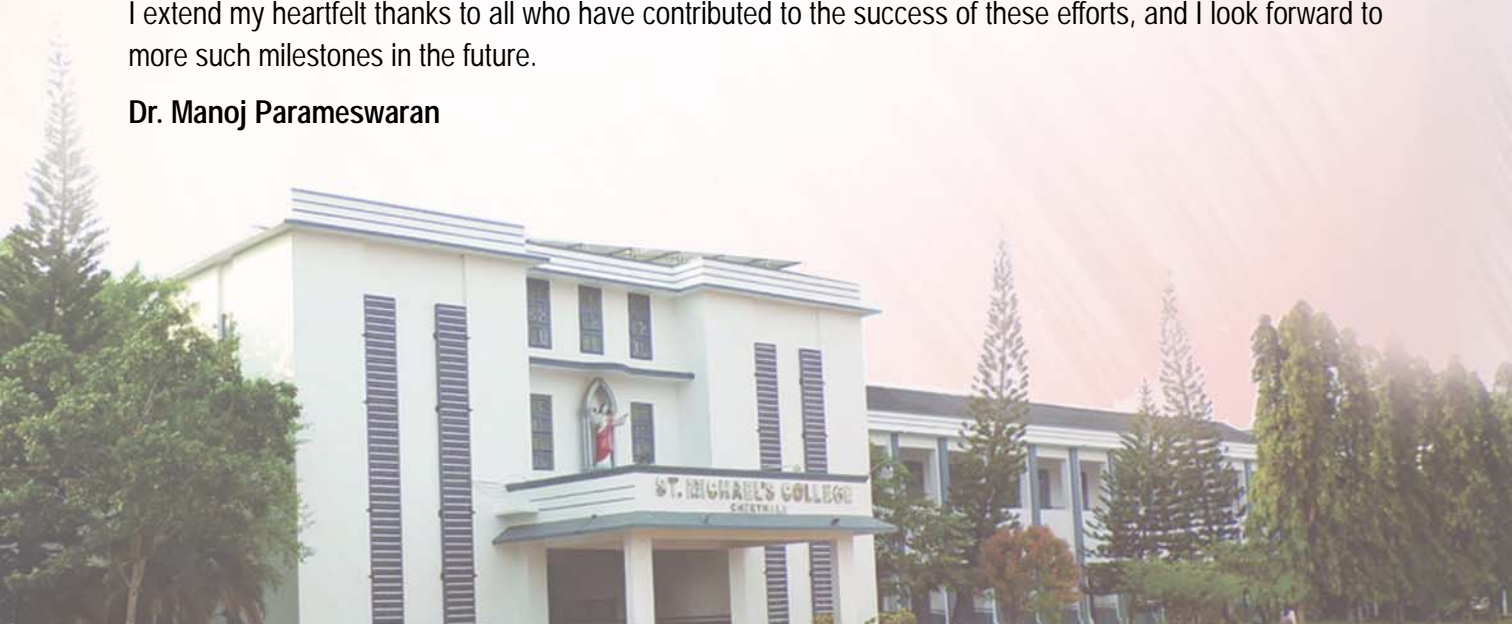

Inauguration of Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP)

The inauguration of the four-year undergraduate program, **SMC Vijnanolsavam – 2K24**, took place on July 1, 2024, at the college auditorium. The state-level ceremony was inaugurated by the Honorable Chief Minister of Kerala, Sri. Pinarayi Vijayan, while the college-level event was launched by Justice Cyriac Joseph, Honorable Judge of the Supreme Court.

As part of this program, the college offers a wide range of courses, including BA Honours with Research in Economics (specializing in Data Science), BA Honours in English Language and Literature, BSc Honours with Research in Chemistry (specializing in Forensic Chemistry), BSc Honours in Zoology (focused on Fisheries Science), BSc Honours with Research in Physics (specializing in Electronics), BCom Honours with Research and Elective Finance, and BBA Honours with Specialisation in Logistics Management.

The program began with a welcome address by Dr. Antony Kuriakose, the Vice Principal of the college. The event was presided over by the college Principal, Prof. (Dr.) Sindhu S. Nair. Rev. Fr. (Dr.) Celestine Puthenpurakal, the College Manager, delivered the benedictory address, while Smt. Priya Antony extended her felicitations. The program concluded with a vote of thanks from Dr. Binil K. P, the Program Coordinator.

On the second day, July 2, 2024, Dr. Pratheesh P. provided an introduction to the FYUGP program, and Dr. Antony Kuriakose outlined the course registration process for the students. Additionally, each department made presentations about the courses they offer. The event wrapped up with an interactive session, allowing students to ask questions and engage in discussions.

Entrepreneurial Skill Development Training Programme

The Women Cell, in collaboration with the Kerala State Women Development Corporation, conducted an Entrepreneurial Skill Development training program on October 23, 2024.

The session was led by Smt. Beena Shymon, a faculty member in Fashion Designing and Apparel Making at St. Michael's Community College. Sixty female students participated in the program, where they were trained in various activities, including crafting flowers and flower pots using materials such as art paper, shoe components, and reusable waste. The training also included demonstrations of fabric painting techniques on cloth and bottles.



The students were educated on the significance of self-entrepreneurship as a means of future financial sustainability. They learned how developing skills to create diverse products from different materials could serve as a source of income. Actively engaging in all activities, the participants created flowers and flower pots from plastic bottles and practiced fabric painting on glass bottles and handkerchiefs.



SHILP- An Art n' CRAFT Exhibition

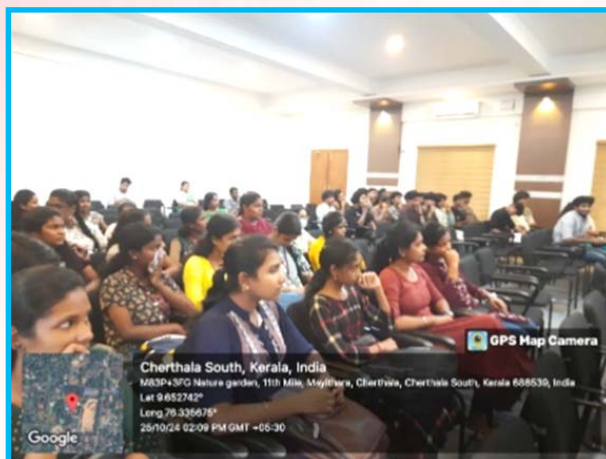

familiarize themselves with R programming, focusing on data handling, visualization, and basic statistical functions.

The second day focused on advanced statistical techniques and real-world applications of data mining in economic research. The resource person for the second day was Dr. Muhammed Suhail M.U, Assistant professor on contract, Department of Economics, MES College, Nedumkandam. The Sessions included:

- Hypothesis testing and data analysis
- Time series analysis and forecasting models
- Clustering and classification techniques using R
- Case studies demonstrating the use of R in economic data analysis knowledge to datasets, enhancing their analytical proficiency.

The workshop concluded with an interactive Q&A session and a feedback session where participants shared their learning experiences. The two-day workshop was highly successful in providing participants with a strong foundation in data mining and statistical analysis using R. Under the RUSA 2.0 project, recognizing the need to

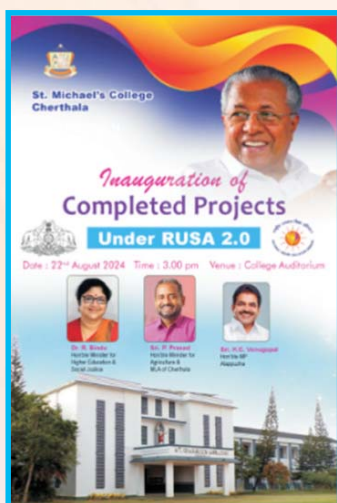
enhance teaching-learning resources and physical

infrastructure, the college initiated the construction and

renovation of various facilities, including labs, the library,

and the purchase of sports equipment, starting in 2019

with an allocation of Rs. 2 crore. One of the key



achievements of this project was the completion of a 7,000 sq. ft. Examination Hall cum Coaching Centre, built with an investment of Rs. 90.95 lakhs, significantly boosting the college's physical infrastructure.

Additionally, the renovation of the roofing for the Physics Wing, Zoology Lab, and Museum was completed, along with the installation of tiles from the portico extending across the entire floor of the central block, ensuring a comfortable walking experience. The long-standing demand of the female students, who constitute two-thirds of the student body, for a Toilet Block and Amenity Centre was addressed with an allocation of Rs. 82.30 lakhs from the RUSA funds. The renovated toilet block now includes 18 toilets, 2 bathrooms, a dress changing room, and 8 wash basins, all equipped with proper lighting and water supply.

Furthermore, modern equipment for various laboratories and a Health and Fitness Gym with 5 stations have been purchased. Efforts are underway to further digitize the library, including the installation of Smart Screens, with a budget of Rs. 20 lakhs set aside for this purpose.

Through these extensive construction and renovation efforts under RUSA 2.0, the college aims to achieve significant advancements in the quality of higher education, aligning with its goals for development and improvement.

A Milestone in Research: First Ph.D. Graduate from Department of Chemistry
