

Field Visit to Vagamon

Field trip to study the ecology and environmental concerns of a place is one of the important green initiatives of the Department of English. The department has been able to conduct three field visits and a nature camp in the previous years and these activities gave the students an opportunity to understand some of the profound aspects associated with environmental conservation and regeneration. This year the department conducted a field trip to Vagamon on the 12th of October, 2024 in association with the Department of Botany of the college to analyse the various ecological and environmental issues of the place. A team of 34 students and 6 staff took part in the field visit. A preparatory session, by Dr. Teny David, Asst. Prof of Botany, on the Ecology and Species Variety of Vagamon as well as the importance and necessity of environmental conservation was held on the 9th of October, 2024. A session on the history of Western Ghats, Notable geographical features and important flora and fauna of the place was also given to the participants enroute the destination. A project report compiled by the students was also prepared as part of the field visit.


The inaugural function was followed by an insightful keynote session by Dr Raju Sebastian, Associate Professor and Head, Department of English, St. Berchmans College, Changanassery. He delivered a lecture on Moulding Youngsters for Future-Ready Communication: The Role of ELT. He discussed how English language education must evolve to equip students with skills necessary for the global environment. This was followed by a session by Dr. Anej Somaraj, Associate Professor, Christian






College, Chengannur, who discussed Innovative Pedagogical Strategies and Challenges in Implementing them.

On the second day, the plenary session was led by Dr. Jibu Mathew George, Professor, EFLU, Hyderabad on Research Writing: Argumentation, Articulation, Fallacy. He elaborated on effective academic writing strategies, emphasising logical argumentation and clarity of expression. Following this Dr Vishnu Narayanan, Director, Centre for English Language Teaching, University of Kerala, delivered a lecture on From Play to Proficiency: Gamification as a Pedagogical Tool in ELT. He explored the role of gamification in enhancing language learning engagement and retention.







The two-day seminar successfully provided a platform for meaningful discussions on contemporary ELT practices. The expert sessions and research presentations contributed to a deeper understanding of the challenges and innovations in English language teaching. The collaboration between St. Michael's College and the University of Kerala's Centre for English Language Teaching enriched the academic endeavour, making the event a valuable learning experience for all participants. To commemorate International Mother Language Day, the Malayalam Department organized a special program on February 21 at 9:30 am, featuring an interactive session with a writer, a keynote speech, and the launch of a magazine. Two-Day Orientation on Ph.D. Course Work

The first day of the two-day orientation program on Ph.D. coursework, held on 14th February 2025, focused on Research Methodology. The event was conducted at the Reynolds Centre for Research and Excellence, St. Michael's College, Cherthala, under the joint collaboration of the Commerce Researchers' Forum of St. Michael's College and Sanatana Dharma College, Alappuzha. The sessions aimed at enhancing the research capabilities of scholars, providing them with a structured understanding of various research methods, data collection techniques, and research design frameworks.

The inaugural session commenced at 10:00 AM, with an introduction to the objectives of the orientation program. The first session on Fundamentals of Research was led by Dr. Priya R, Assistant Professor and Research Supervisor from the Department of Commerce, SD College, Alappuzha. She provided insightful discussions on defining research problems, conducting a literature review, and formulating research objectives and hypotheses, setting a strong foundation for the scholars.

The second session, delivered by Jibil K John, a research scholar from SD College, Alappuzha, focused on Methods of Research. He elaborated on qualitative and quantitative methodologies, mixed-method approaches, and effective research designs. Her session provided a comparative analysis of different research methodologies and their applicability in various disciplines. Following a brief lunch break, the third session on Sampling Design was conducted by Arya Thomson, a research scholar from SD College, Alappuzha. She covered essential aspects such as different types of sampling, determining sample size, and methods









of data collection, offering practical strategies to ensure robust and unbiased research. The final session of the









day, Analysis of Data, was handled by Badusha Muhammed, a research scholar from St. Michael's College, Cherthala. He guided the participants through primary and secondary data analysis techniques, hypothesis testing, and the principles of research report writing. His interactive approach helped scholars gain practical knowledge in handling research data. The day concluded with an open discussion and Q&A session, where participants actively engaged with the speakers, clarifying doubts and sharing insights from their research experiences. The first day provided a strong methodological base, ensuring that scholars were well-prepared to approach research systematically.

The second day of the orientation, held on 15th February 2025, emphasized Research and Publication Ethics, a crucial aspect of academic research. This session aimed to equip scholars with knowledge on ethical research practices, integrity in academic writing, and the responsible dissemination of research findings. The day began with a session on Research Philosophy and Ethics, conducted

by Parvathy P, a research scholar from St. Michael's College, Cherthala. She discussed key topics such as research paradigms, different branches of research philosophy, and ethical considerations in academic research. Her session highlighted the importance of maintaining ethical standards while conducting and presenting research. The second session, led by Badusha Muhammed, focused on Scientific Conduct. He addressed important aspects of intellectual honesty, research integrity, and issues related to scientific misconduct, including fabrication, falsification, and plagiarism. His session emphasized the responsibility of scholars in maintaining transparency and credibility in their research.

Following the lunch break, the third session on Publication Ethics was conducted by Dr. Patricia Robin, UGC Librarian at St. Michael's College, Cherthala. She elaborated on publication guidelines, standard-setting initiatives like COPE (Committee on Publication Ethics) and WAME (World Association of Medical Editors), and ethical concerns such as duplicate publication, selective reporting, and open-access publishing. The session provided crucial insights for scholars on how to navigate the challenges of academic publishing. The final session of the program focused on Database and Research Metrics, again led by Dr. Patricia Robin. She explained various types of academic databases, bibliometric indicators, and research impact metrics. The session equipped scholars with tools to access credible sources and track their research impact effectively. The two-day event concluded with a valedictory session, where participants expressed their gratitude for the insightful discussions and practical knowledge shared during the program. The organizing committee members, including Dr. Priya R, Mrs. Soumya Mathew, Benedict TG, Akhila M Panicker, Sumesh S, and Sreepriya S, were acknowledged for their contributions to the successful execution of the event. The orientation program proved to be an enriching experience for all attendees, significantly enhancing their understanding of research methodology and publication ethics. The combination of expert lectures, interactive discussions, and real-world examples provided the scholars with the necessary tools to navigate their doctoral research journey with confidence and integrity.

Chemistry Association: Chemforum 2024


