Zoology Museum Visit

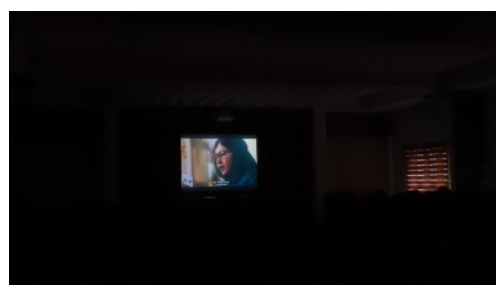

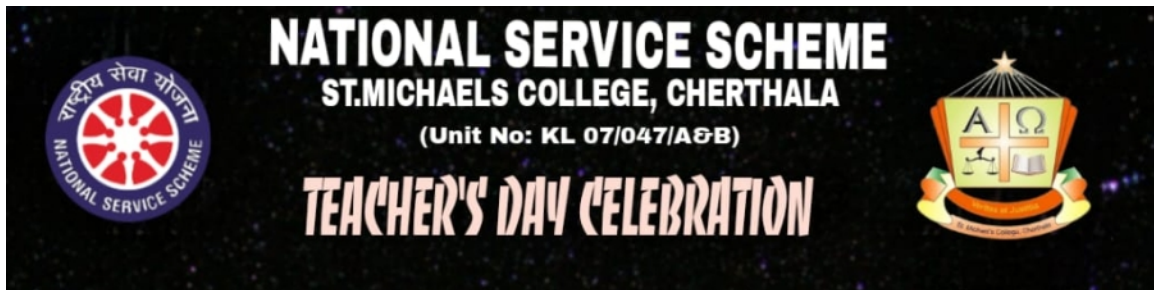
Medical Camp

Report of NAAC Peer Team Visit: 30.09.2024 to 01.10.2024

The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) peer team visited St. Michael's College, Cherthala, for the 3rd cycle of assessment and accreditation on September 30 and October 1, 2024. The team comprised Prof. (Dr.) Bijender Kumar Punia, former Vice Chancellor of Maharshi Dayanand University, Hisar, Haryana, as chairperson; Prof. (Dr.) Mohd Rizwan Khan, Professor of English at Aligarh Muslim University, as member coordinator; and Prof. (Dr.) Ramachandra R. K., Principal of Government College Rajahmundry, Andhra Pradesh, as a member.

On September 29, 2024, the Principal, Prof. (Dr.) Sindhu S. Nair, along with the Vice-Principal and NAAC Coordinator, Dr. Antony Kuriakose, and IQAC Coordinator, Dr. Manoj Parameswaran, welcomed the NAAC peer team members at the hotel. They held a meeting to finalize the schedule for the two-day visit.

The visit included a comprehensive evaluation of the academic, administrative, and extracurricular facets of the institution. The peer team received a guard of honor from the NCC Army Wing of St. Michael's College, followed by a formal presentation by the Principal at 9:15 a.m. The presentation outlined the history, mission, vision, core values, academic accomplishments, infrastructure, faculty expertise, and future aspirations, of the institution providing the team with a broad perspective on the operations and strategic vision of the college.

At 10:30 a.m., an interactive meeting was held with staff members, allowing the peer team to address their questions. This was followed by a session with the non-teaching staff. The NAAC team then toured various departments to assess the academic environment, teaching methods, faculty profiles, and student facilities. Departments showcased their achievements in research, academic programs, and student development. Faculty members engaged in discussions with the team, elaborating on their teaching and learning approaches. 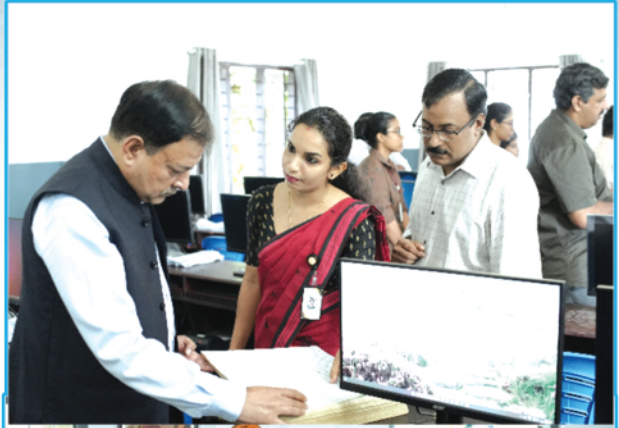
