1. World Environment Day (05/06/2025)

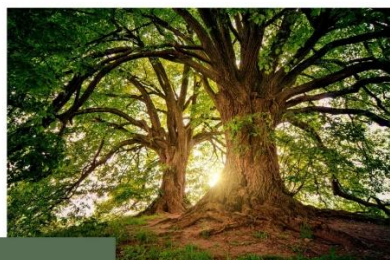


6. Olympic Day (23/06/2025)

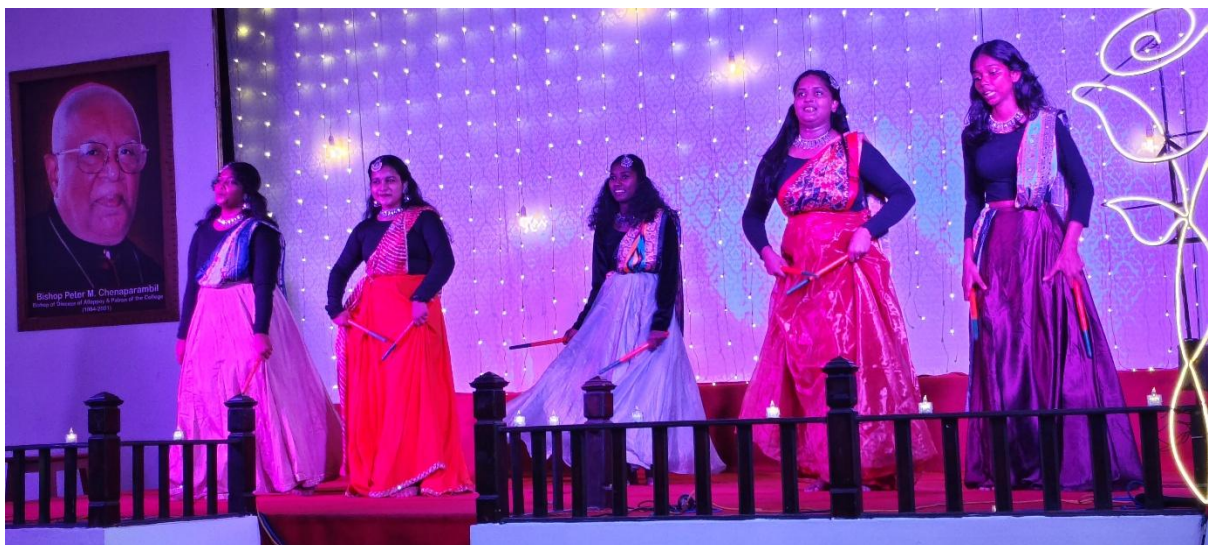
13. CRAT- Training (18/10/2025)

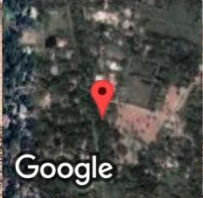

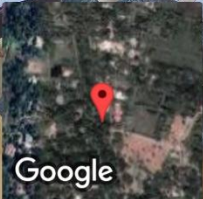

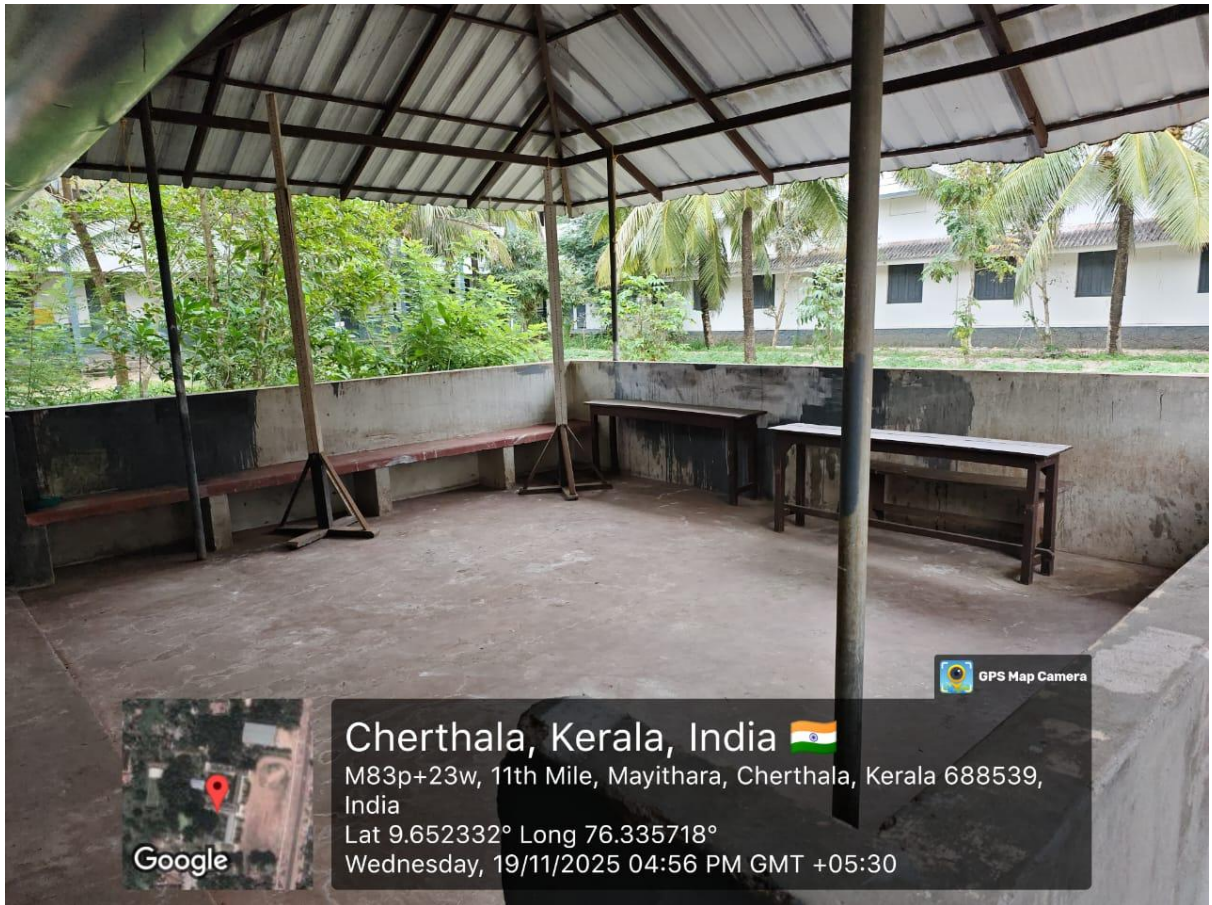




19. Campus Sweep programme (19/11/2025)

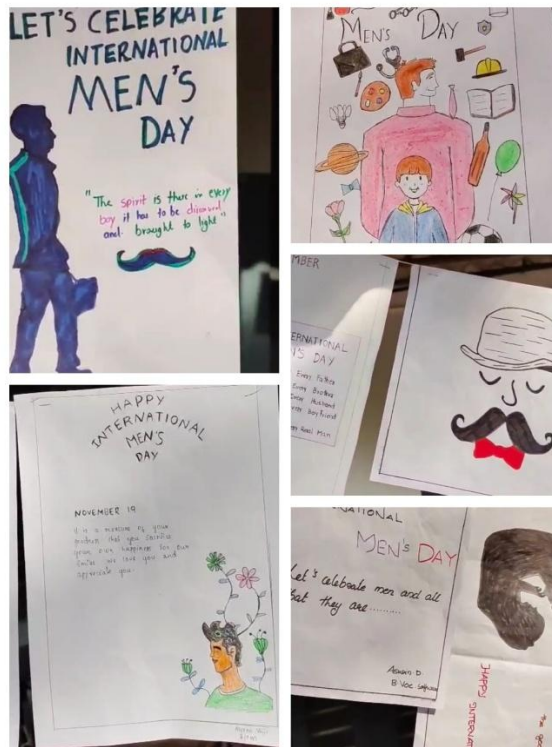
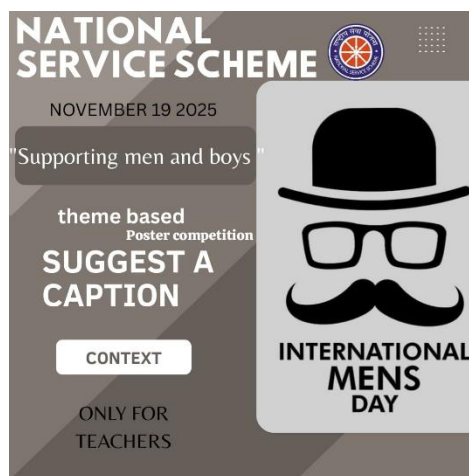

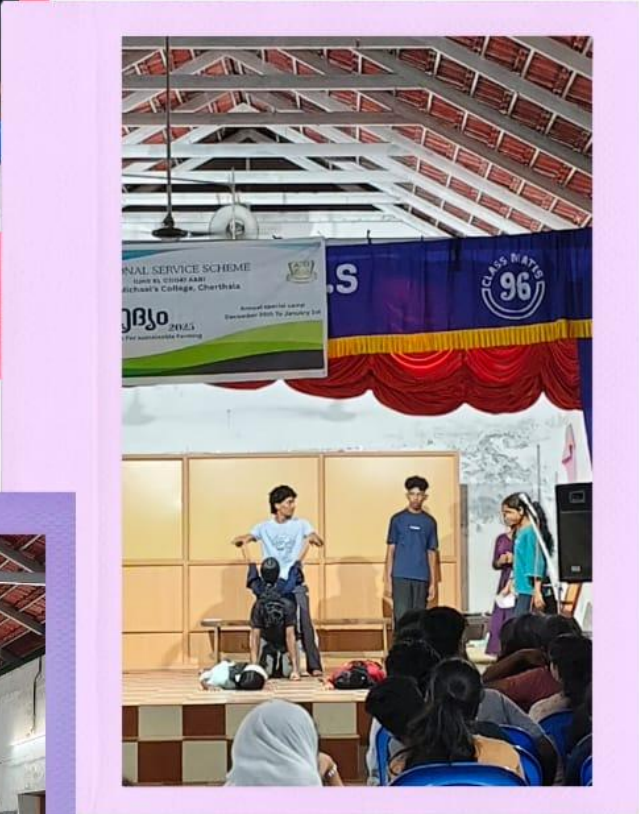










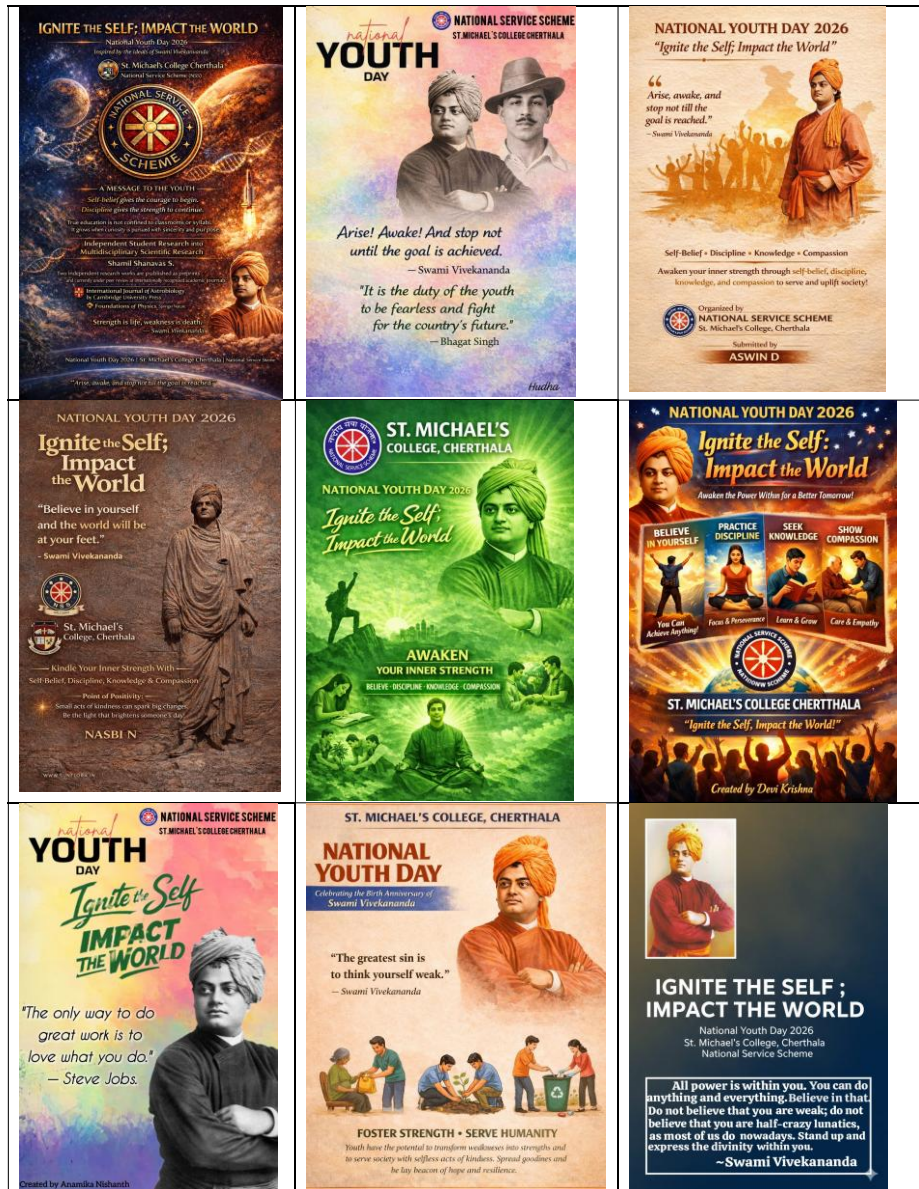




25. National youth day (12/01/2026)

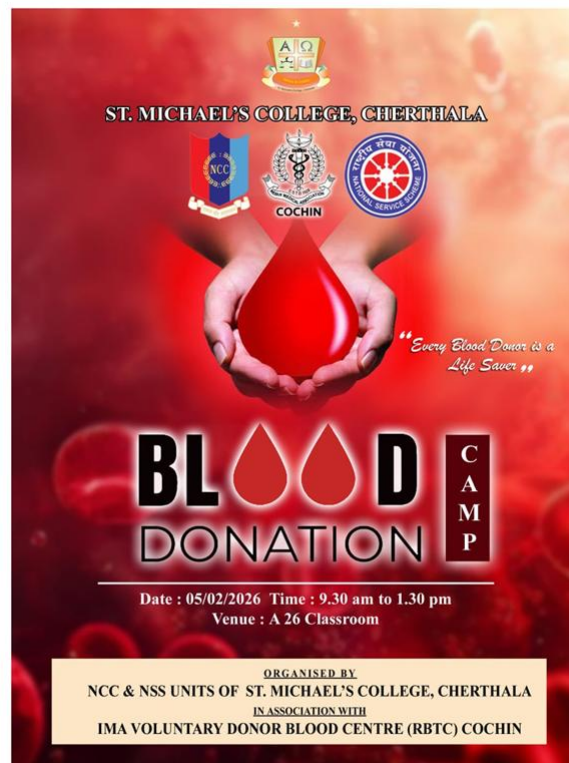




29. Blood Donation Camp (05/02/2026)

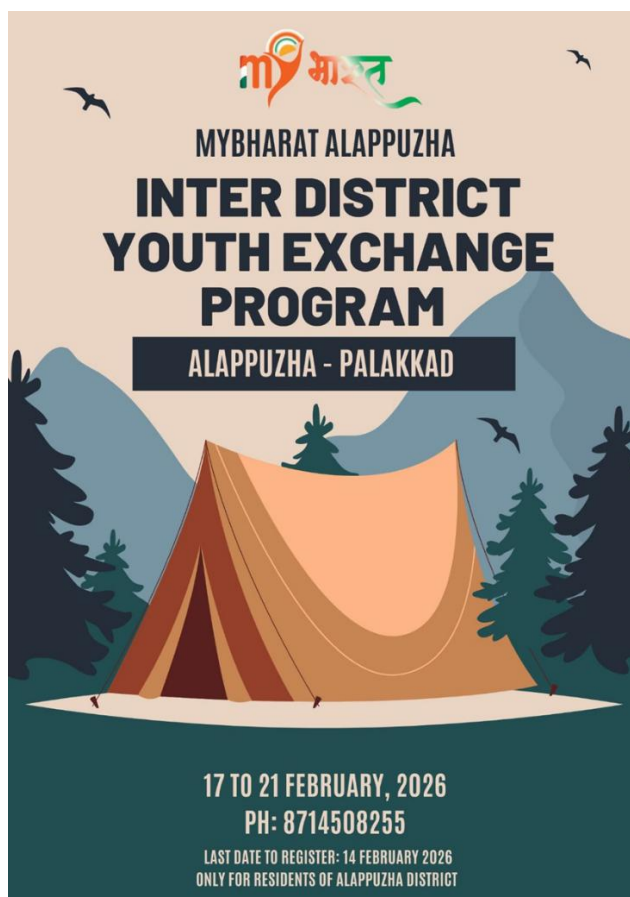


